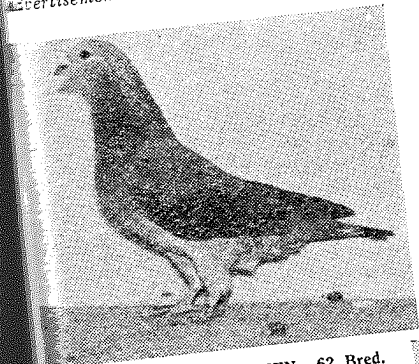


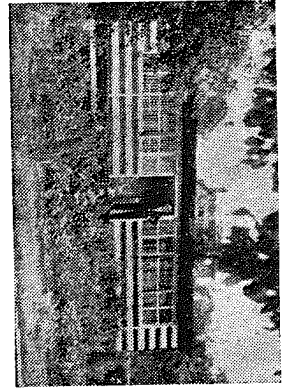

1947-1962 my team have won £2,700 and 41 Trophies.
 1947 won £170, 1948 won £100, 1949 won £172 and fifteen 1sts and about fifteen Fed. wins.
 1950 won £250, twenty 1sts and about 20 Fed. wins and about fifteen Fed. wins.
 1951 won £260, fifteen 1sts, eighteen 2nds, eight Fed. wins.
 1952 won £235, nineteen 1sts and about twelve Fed. wins.
 1953 won £110, longest inland race (368 miles) by 1 1/2 hours.
 1954 won £255, sixteen 1sts and about ten Fed. wins, including three times 1st Fed.
 1955 won £371, forty 1sts, sixteen 2nds and about twelve Fed. wins, including three times 1st Fed.
 also Fed. Average (600 members).
 1956 won £335, nineteen 1sts, nine cups and Fed. Average again and eight Fed. wins, including 1st and 3rd Fed. vel. 925 and 922, 3rd and 5th Fed. vel. 806 and 750 in longest Y.B. race (170 miles) in Darrell Open Y.B. race won 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 11th and 17th and £38, vel. 700, etc., finishing 20 miles farther than any other winner.
 1957-1962, the above wins unfortunately barred me from competing in 3 of my 4 clubs. They either disbanded or stopped duplications. I now only compete in one club, Clydebank (30 members). Glasgow Fed. (900 members), 1962 now 500 members only. I fly 10-20 miles farther to the N. West than 75% of them.

I have concentrated on breeding winners for others and time will prove this to be the case. To mention a few, Mealy Hen Dan of R. Baxter's (Annan) and Open Scottish Nat. 1957, Red Cock Open Race winner and 7821 winner of 1st and £100. Both born Nat. for R. Baxter who won over winner 71st Open Scottish Nat. and £115 in 1959; all of my Gurnays and R. Baxter who won over £500 in those three Nat. Races and all Averages in the very strong and rich Club many times, and Open Pan Nat. 1959 by 45 yards for Mr. Waghorn flying 652 miles, 27th Pan Nat. for Mr. Selwyn 1960 flying 643 miles. 1st Glasgow Fed. (all Sections), 600 members Cheltenham (300 miles) for late Bob Malkman. A. Auld, Kilmarnock and Mr. Smith, Kilmarnock, have won many prizes with my stock. Tom Dick, Saltcoats has flown very well. He bought, among others, my Champ. Pled Hen 50G5111, dam of many winners and herself a big winner, being Aunt and also of the lineage of Mr. Waghorn's 2nd Open Pan Nat. winner.

My birds are flown on the natural system, racing 10 old birds and 17 young birds weekly. 1962 season my team flew very well, winning about £70 also winning Club and Federation Y.B. Averages and Cup. Flew in only 1 Channel Race (Kilmarnock National) 1962 and a very hard Race getting 7th out of 12 when many great winning teams went down. Won 1st, 2nd and 9th Fed. and won 7th in Fed. Open Y.B. Race winning Nom. in Club about £10 and had 3 out of 6 in Y.B. National (300 miles) clocking just out of prizes. Have 36 flown young birds in 1961.

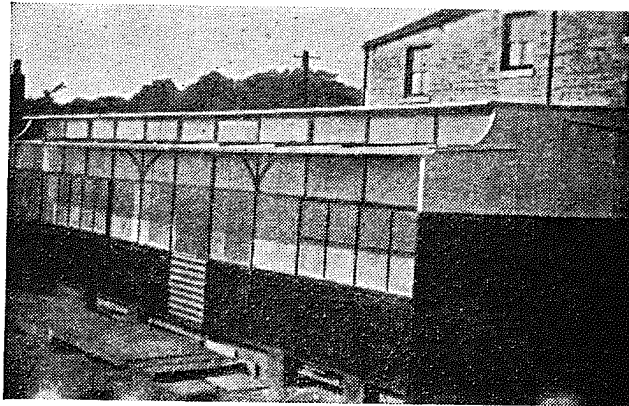
