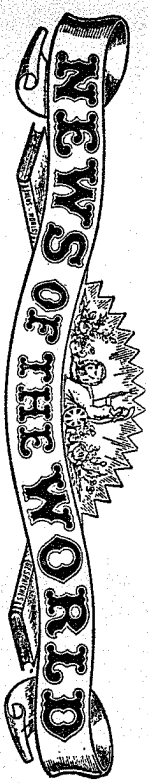

N.F.C. race from Mirhinde (800 miles). Three birds sent, 1939, two home—one winning the Suggitt Trophy, winner of O.B. Average Challenge Cup 1936 and 1937 and the O.B. and Y.B. Combined Average Cup 1938 and 1939; also the following positions in the strong Gosforth and Arthur's Hill Clubs: 1937—1st and 2nd Selby, 2nd Retford, 1st Hitchin, 1st Newhaven, 1st Arras (400 miles), 1st and 6th Melun (500 miles); 1st, 2nd and 3rd Nevets (600 miles); 1st, 2nd and 3rd Grantham; 3rd Hitchin; 3rd Melun (500 miles); 1st, 2nd and 3rd Nevets (600 miles); 1939—1st and 2nd Retford; 1st, 2nd and 3rd Grantham; 1st Melun (500 miles); and 1st Nevets (600 miles). In addition to various Federation, Championship Club and Y.B. race points, they own by winning four 1sts, two 2nds, and five 3rds. In 1944 and 1942 very little racing was possible, but on my return home in 1943 my birds have again done exceptionally well, winning 1st Selby, 2nd Retford, 1st Grantham, 1st, 2nd and 3rd Grantham, and 1st Newcastle Federation and Cup, 1st Yearling nomination and 1st Club Chichester (300 miles). It is largely due to the generosity and friendship of the above well-known fanciers that my lot of birds has so well held its own in the Newcastle area where competition is real competition and as keen as anywhere in the country. It will be seen that my birds are particularly good in long-distance racing. Particulars of Squeakers will be sent on application.

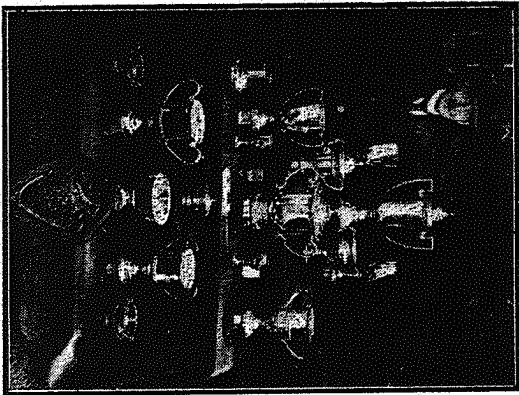

Handicapping does not always stop a winner. I won the O.B. Average Cup and Medal every year from 1925 to 1933 in the Derby H.S. The members then decided to leave Lerwick out of the average, so did not compete for three seasons, 1937-1938. I again won the Cup and Medal. They then decided to leave Thurso out, but again, 1939-1940, I won the O.B. Average. In 1941, 1942 and 1943 I did no racing, but all birds have been on the road.

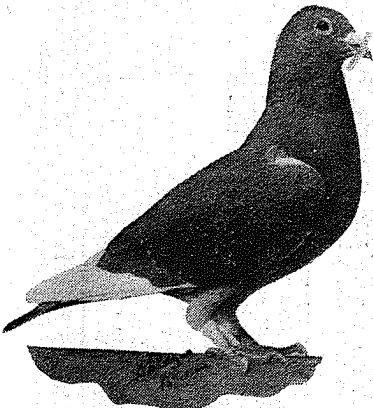

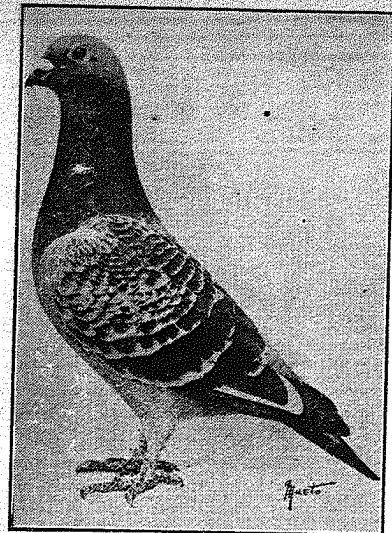
